## **Counterpoint Final Composition Project**

**OVERVIEW:** From the themes for grounds and passacaglias given, select one to create your composition.

## **GRADING:**

This piece will count as your final examination for this course. As such, please take it extremely seriously. START EARLY SO I CAN HELP YOU!

## **GUIDELINES:**

- Each student must use a different passacaglia or ground theme.
- Your piece must be at least <u>32 measures</u> long. It is acceptable for the ground to be stated by itself for the first <u>4 measures</u> only.
- Your piece must follow all the conventions of Baroque counterpoint as outlined in the Baroque counterpoint packet, including chord progressions, 6/4 chord usage, treatment of sequential patterns (if applicable), etc.
- Your piece must be musically interesting. Think about how you can increase the musical tension over the course of the piece (ex: faster note values, higher notes, etc.).
- You MUST include roman numerals.
- Your piece may be handwritten, but computer-engraved versions are encouraged if you know how to use the software.

## **DUE DATES:**

- A draft of all 32 measures of the piece will be due on Wednesday, December 1.
- On Friday, December 3, I will spend the period discussing individual pieces.
- We will meet during the scheduled final exam time for you to submit and listen to the "final versions" of all the pieces. The final exam is scheduled for **Wednesday, December 8, 9:30 a.m.**.
- A late penalty of <u>5 points per calendar weekday</u> will be strictly enforced for the DRAFT and the FINAL versions.

Remember, you are creating a musical composition, not doing a theory worksheet.
