
JAZZ CHORDS WORKSHEET: ADVANCED SCALES 1



LISTED BELOW IS A SERIES OF CHORDS (NOT INTENDED TO BE PLAYED AS A PROGRESSION). WRITE THE MODE/SCALE THAT WOULD MOST COMMONLY BE USED TO IMPROVISE OVER EACH CHORD. USE ACCIDENTALS, NOT KEY SIGNATURES. THEN, WRITE THE NAME OF THE SCALE/CHORD UNDERNEATH EACH CHORD. THE CHORD SYMBOLS COVERED ON THIS WORKSHEET ARE: $\triangle #4$ (LYDIAN), $\triangle #5$ (LYDIAN AUGMENTED), 7#5 (WHOLE TONE), 7#11 (LYDIAN DOMINANT), 7ALT (ALTERED OR DIMINISHED WHOLE TONE), AND SUSD (PHYRGIAN). CONSULT THE REFERENCE CHART FIRST IF YOU ARE IN DOUBT ABOUT THESE CHORD SYMBOLS.







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
