LISTED BELOW IS A SERIES OF CHORDS (NOT INTENDED TO BE PLAYED AS A PROGRESSION). REMEMBER, THE BASIC TAZZ SCALES ARE MAJOR ($^{\triangle 7}$ =MAJOR), MINOR-MAJOR ($^{-\Delta 7}$ =ASC. MEL. MINOR), MIXOLYDIAN (7 =MAJ. 6 7), DORIAN ($^{-7}$), LOCRIAN OR HALF-DIMINISHED ($^{\varnothing 7}$), AND DIMINISHED ($^{\circ 7}$).

WRITE THE MODE/SCALE THAT WOULD MOST COMMONLY BE USED TO IMPROVISE OVER EACH CHORD. USE ACCIDENTALS, NOT KEY SIGNATURES. THEN, WRITE THE NAME OF THE SCALE/CHORD UNDERNEATH EACH CHORD. FINALLY, CIRCLE THE MAIN CHORD NOTES (ROOT, THIRD, FIFTH, AND SEVENTH).
